

F.E.E.L.-Effect



According to the UN, in 2015 more than 65 million people around the world have been forced from home. Only a few of them reach the borders of Europe. While the European governments are pushing forward the foreclosure of the continent by installing fences and walls, several thousands of volunteers and full-time workers are helping in the area of conflict driven by humanitarianism. It is their dedication inspired us to create our own project.

Our idea

We are a group of students from Coburg and Munich that developed the idea of an organization to support refugees and helpers which we realized in the project „F.E.E.L.-Effect“. Therefore we have planned to offer our help between the Balkans and Central Europe, including a four weeks engagement in Thessaloniki (Greece) and a two weeks support of a project in Serbia. Greece and Serbia were chosen as target countries on purpose, because of their precarious situations. The project is supposed to run about ten weeks time, starting at the end of September 2017. Besides voluntary work in organizations we envision collecting information about the living conditions in host countries along our route, publishing our experiences via blogs and events in Germany. To realize the project we were granted permission to become part of the “Schmetterlingseffekt“ society which is located in Coburg.
